1. INTRODUCTION (ALL CAPTIONS SHOULD BE TYPED IN SMALL CAPS (12 POINTS))

This section should include introduction to your topic, objectives, significance and other key elements. Subsection under all main headings should follow the same format. Example-

1.1 Purpose of the study

All subsections should be **bold** and left justified. As much possible, sections below this level should be avoided. If necessary, only 3-4 subsections should be used.

2. LITERATURE REVIEW

This section should include the discussion about the work of others in areas close to your own project. The purpose of this section is to elucidate and highlight the work done by others in similar areas or domains. Your work will be an enhancement to what has been already done by others in the same field. APA style should be used for citing the work done by others. As an example, Kubala (1998) in his paper "Addressing student needs: Teaching on the internet" discussed the use of internet for engaging students.

3. METHODOLOGY

This section should include what, where and how of your research work. It should cover the details about location of your research work, sample size, tools you will be using (such as interviews, surveys or experiment/s) to collect data. The Research Questions (RQs) and Hypothesis (H) that will be explored and tested should also be listed here. This section should also include discussion about statistical analysis tools and technologies that will be used to analyze data. In a nutshell, this section should provide a clear insight into how you will conduct your research work.

4. RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

This section will cover discussion based on the statistical analysis of data. It should include tables, graphs, pictures derived from the data analysis. This section will focus on answering Research Questions (RQs) and test results of Hypothesis (H) proposed in the previous section. Elaborate discussion about the outcomes of the research and its significance should be covered in this section. All figures and tables containing data should be placed centrally and labeled as

given below. Fonts will be the same (12 Pts. Times Roman) for all Figures and Tables. See the example below. All sources of figures and data should be cited)
